

The Master of Music (M.M.) with an Area of Emphasis in Music Therapy provides in-depth study of the practice of music therapy, including research, clinical applications, and current developments in music therapy theory and practice. Coursework will address the Advanced Competencies in Music Therapy as established by the American Music Therapy Association and is intended for current board-certified music therapists (MT-BCs).

The program is comprised of a diverse set of academic and clinical experiences including music theory, music history/ethnomusicology, other related music studies, electives in the student's area of interest, and the core music therapy courses (Trends and Issues in Music Therapy, Research in Music Therapy, Seminar in Professional Music Therapy Practice, Advanced Music Therapy Practicum, and Graduate Professional Project in Music Therapy).

Primary career opportunities for graduates of this degree program include the advanced practice of music therapy in a variety of healthcare and educational settings, and teaching music therapy at the undergraduate level. The degree also prepares graduates for future study in music therapy at the doctoral level.
