Application Process

To perform on the Reynolds Plantation, Lake Oconee Performance/Lecture Series in 2019, submit an application via email to Amy Pollard by 2 April 2018. Include the following:

Additional Policies and Procedures

- Program length should be no more than an hour, with no intermission. There is an expectation that the performers will speak to the audience and provide some information about themselves and the music being performed. It is also fine to leave time during the performance for audience questions, if desired.
- Generally, performers can have access to the space from 5-6 pm to do a warm-up and sound check. The cocktail/dinner portion begins at 630 pm and the performances begin around 8 pm.
- Performers will receive a box lunch type of meal—this is the expectation, though occasionally it might be more formal. This meal will generally be provided in a separate room from the diners.
 - Reynolds policy states that spouses of faculty or significant others of performers are not permitted at the performance, only the performers and faculty coach, if applicable.
- There are two main performance spaces which are adjacent to each other:
 - The Rock House: an intimate space that seats 32 members in a dinner format. Can accommodate up to 8 performers, but no piano is available within the space.
 - The Lake Club: a larger venue that accommodates between 24-90 members. The largest group that has been used in this space has been 35 performers. A piano is available for this space.
- Groups must supply their own stands and stand lights for the performance as well as any necessary equipment other than chairs and a microphone/speaker for speaking to the audience.

- The faculty representative is responsible for submitting photos, website links, and other promotional material as requested by Reynolds Lake Oconee after acceptance of the program and arrangement of the date of performance, but in no case less than three months before the performance date.
- \$1000 will go into an appropriate area and/or research budget, to be used to benefit students—travel, 1-time scholarships or TA support, music, etc.
- Performance expenses paid from other proceeds—for travel mileage, etc.
- By submitting this proposal, you are agreeing to the terms and conditions outlined above.

From Athens:

- 1. Travel on HWY. 15 Southeast to Greensboro
- 2. Upon entering Greensboro turn left at West Broad Street
- 3. Turn right onto Main Street/GA 44W/S (this will be the 3rd cross street)
- 4. Continue on GA 44/Main Street (approximately 14 miles)
- 5. Turn left onto Linger Longer Road and go approximately 1 mile
- 6. Turn left onto Lake Oconee Trail
- 7. Take 2nd Left & Stop at the Guard Gate

Take a Right at the Stop Sign just past Security.

Travel about 1 Mile and Turn Right Onto Lake Club Drive
